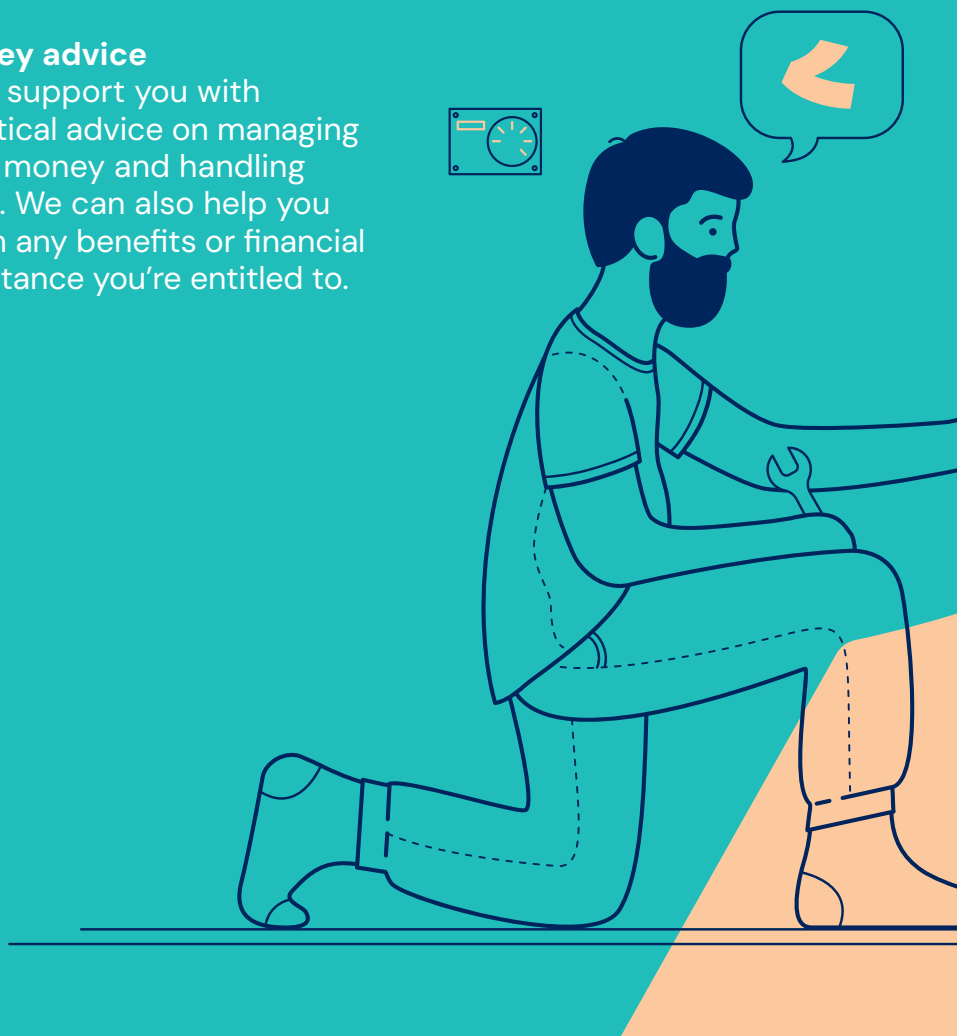

We'll support you with practical advice on managing your money and handling debt. We can also help you claim any benefits or financial assistance you're entitled to.

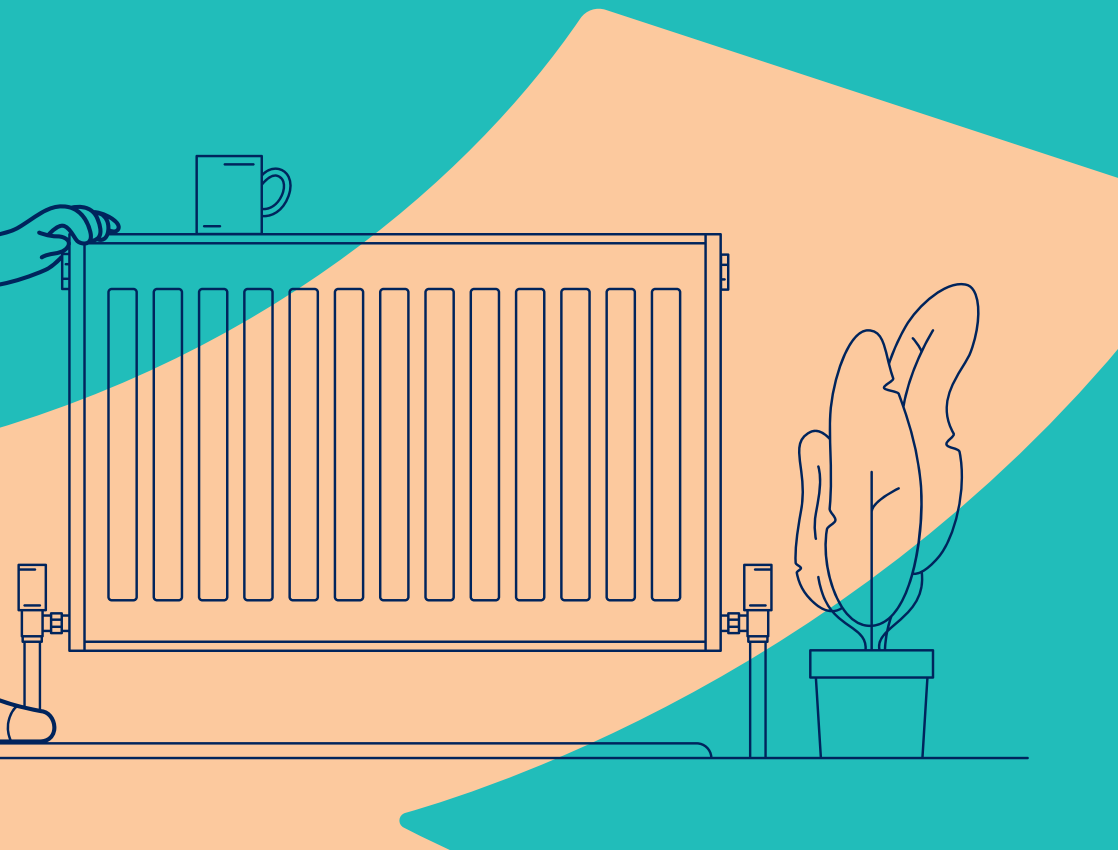


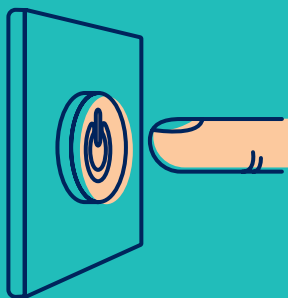
Home improvement support

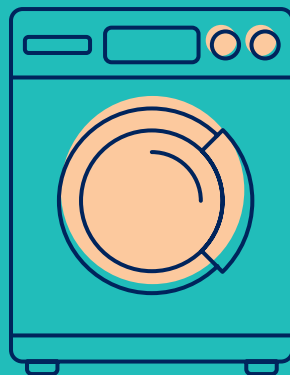
Switch off standby

You can save around £55 a year just by remembering to turn your appliances off standby mode.

Careful with your washing

You can save around £27 a year from your energy bill just by using your washing machine more carefully:

- ◀ Wash on a 30-degree cycle instead of higher temperatures.
- ◀ Reduce your washing machine use by one run per week for a year.

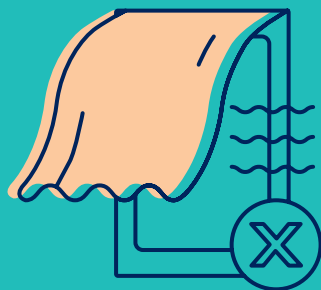


Take control of your heating

Turning your heating thermostat down by 1 degree could save £100 a year on your energy bills. Turn down the heat in rooms you're not using to save even more, and wear layered clothes to avoid feeling the chill while chilling at home.

Draught proof your home

Draught-proofing of windows, doors, floors and skirting boards can save around £90 a year on energy bills.



Avoid the tumble dryer

Avoid using a tumble dryer for your clothes: dry clothes on racks inside where possible or outside in warmer weather to save £55 a year.
